# Legislative Updates – As of April 15, 2019 Other actions in the Senate

• The current Senate budget proposal mirrors most of the K12 provisions in the House-passed plan. The biggest difference in the two plans so far is the addition by the Senate of \$15 million to the Base Student Cost (BSC) under the Education Finance Act (EFA) funding. This will amount to about \$15 per student. Unless those provisions are amended by the full Senate, they will be "locked" into the budget. Both budget proposals include \$159 million in additional funding to raise teacher salaries by 4 percent and increase starting teacher salaries from \$32,000 to \$35,000.

- Amended and gave third reading to a House-passed resolution (<u>H.3929</u>) authorizing the State Board of Education to waive the requirements of making up days beyond the three days forgiven by the local board for any days missed during the 2018-2019 school year due to weather or other disruptions requiring schools to close. The Senate amended further to give the local school board the authority to make up days beyond the three the law currently requires. The bill now heads to a conference committee to work out the differences between the House and Senate versions.
- Gave third reading and sent to the House a bill (S.276) requiring anyone charged with threatening to use a weapon on school property to undergo a mental health evaluation to determine if the person needs further counseling or treatment prior to a bond hearing. The bill also sets fines, establishes levels of criminal charges and clarifies that the threat does not have to be made on the school grounds. The bill was further amended by the Senate to specify that the required mental health screening must be completed by a court-approved mental health professional, mental health facility or a facility operated by the State Department of Mental Health.
- Gave third reading and sent to the House a bill (<u>S.293</u>) that authorizes a governing body of a church, or appropriate church official, that leases school facilities for services to allow a concealed weapons permit holder(s) to carry a weapon into the school during services. The weapon is restricted only to those areas in the school that the church uses for services.
- Moved to the contested calendar a bill requiring high schools, beginning with the 2020-2021 school year, to offer a one-half credit course on personal finance that would count towards graduation (S.15).

### Other actions in the House

- Gave third reading and sent to the Senate a joint resolution (<u>H.4413</u>) that directs the funding of state expenditures in the event the General Assembly does not pass a state budget before the start of the fiscal year on July 1. The resolution specifies if the 2019-2020 state fiscal year begins with no annual general appropriations act, the authority to pay the recurring expenses of state government continues at the level of amounts appropriated in Act 264 of 2018 for the recurring expenses of state government for Fiscal Year 2019-2020.
- Gave third reading and sent to the Senate a bill authorizing the State Board of Education to waive laws and regulations for districts that want to implement a competency-based program. The implementation must be within five years of seeking a waiver, and the program must have student outcomes measured based on mastery of information rather than a set number of days (H.3403)
- Moved to the contested calendar a bill to establish the Workforce and Education Data Oversight Committee (WEDOC) to support the mission of the Coordinating Council for Workforce Development (H.3757). The Committee is comprised of 10 members and is responsible for overseeing the collection, use and linking of data.

## Local fiscal autonomy bill passes

The Senate gave third reading to a House-passed bill authorizing the Abbeville County School District Board of Trustees total fiscal autonomy beginning with the next fiscal year (<u>H.3819</u>). The bill will be enrolled for ratification and sent to the governor, who must sign or veto the bill within five days of it being sent to him (excluding Sunday), or it becomes law without his signature.

## Signed into law

A joint resolution (<u>H.3127</u>) to create the Mold Abatement and Remediation Study Committee to study the health effects of mold in public areas and to ascertain the best method of abatement for the mold was signed into law March 20.

## **For Your Information**

• Hampton Count Council has invited the district to participate in the upcoming 2019-2020 fiscal year budget develop on April 29, 2019 at 5:00 pm. This meeting gives us the opportunity to address the district's operating mill levy. Our current operating millage rate is set at 0.299. Considering recent House and Senate budget proposal regarding teacher salary increase, there will be a need for the district to request a millage increase for fiscal year 2020. However, correspondence was sent to the Office of the Finance/Human Resources Director requesting an alternative date to present our proposal on April 15, 2019.

Board of Trustees Report

Mary Ann Atkins – reported that Board Members attended a conference in PA. One of the sessions attended was "Effective Responses to Student Mental Health Issues. Ms. Atkins stated our students need Mental Health Counseling Services to ensure mental health wellbeing. She said we should have a committee, book studies, a strong leader and ensure all staff is aware that we all have mental health. We should put a focus in our District on mental health.

Jacqueline Hopkins – shared she enjoyed the conference. There was a lot of focus on emotional development, mental health and school consolidation.

Thomas Owens – we have to be proactive about consolidation. We have to speak with our legislative delegates and inquire how it will affect our students. We are arranging a meeting with our delegates to discuss how our district will be affected.

District Consolidation Discussion

Earl Choice has reached out to Bright Matthews, Hutto and Williams to discuss with them the actions we need to take as a district. We will keep the community informed on the consolidation process. The Board members will make themselves available anytime the legislative delegates can meet.

Mr. Wright stated the Senate voted 37-2 to make state financial support available to school district with less than 1,500 students if they make consolidation plans available by August, 2010 and get approval by 2023.
