

End-of-Course Exams are approaching. Here are some tips to assist students to be successful on the test.

EOC English Tip:

Read the Passage You don't want to. There's a little voice

You don't want to. There's a little voice inside of you that says, "Just look for the answers in the passage."

Don't listen to that voice. It is a voice that wants you to fail this test. Seek and find won't help because the wrong answers are in the text too. Most questions are going to be answerable only to those who read the whole thing (theme, purpose, tone, mood, ediciton, etc.)

Common Testing Mistakes:

- O Test too fast
- O Don't try/read all answer choices
- O Don't look up definitions
- O Don't complete short answers or skip them
- O Don't complete or answer prompt correctly or don't do essay (this is automatic fail)
