Strategy of the Month - Reflective Writing

During the month of February our school-wide strategy of the month will be reflective writing. Reflective writing provides students with an opportunity to synthesize what they have learned by writing about it. Reflective writing is different from academic writing in which students write as an expert and the opinions they express are based on objective evidence. Reflective writing is subjective and provides an opportunity for students to reflect on their learning experiences. As students reflect on the learning experiences, they are able slow down their pace of thinking, process their learning and

- make links between concepts and skills;
- integrate new and prior knowledge;
- develop and deepen their understanding;
- explore their own feelings and thoughts, and
- self-reflect on their behaviors, thinking, and knowledge during the learning experience.



Reflective writing provides an opportunity for students to self-assess. Students may identify the successes they had during a learning experience and consider how they might apply those principles to new situations or they may identify mistakes they made which can help them avoid repeating those same mistakes in the future.
