

Positive Behavioral Interventions & Supports - This year, we will continue to be proactive and encourage good behavior through PBIS. It is an approach we use to improve school safety and promote positive behavior. It also helps us decide how to respond to a child who misbehaves. At its heart, PBIS calls on us to teach kids about behavior, just as we would teach about any other subject—like reading or math. PBIS recognizes that kids can only meet behavior expectations if they know what the expectations are. A hallmark of our use of PBIS is that everyone knows appropriate behavior. Throughout the school day—in class, at lunch and on the bus—our students understand what's expected of them.

We believe:

- every child can learn proper behavior.
- stepping in early can prevent more serious behavior problems.
- each child is different and schools need to provide many kinds of behavior support.
- how we teach behavior should be based on research and science.
- following a child's behavioral progress is important.
- we must gather and use data to make decisions about behavior problems.

Keep in mind that PBIS is not a treatment or therapy. It's a framework for teachers, administrators and parents to follow. It's also important to know that our use of PBIS, is for all students. According to several studies, PBIS leads to better student behavior. In many schools that use PBIS, students receive fewer detentions and suspensions, and get better grades. There's also some evidence that PBIS may lead to less bullying.
